Improving social mobility by, generally but not solely, funding educational initiatives and aspirational programmes which can lead to increased opportunities for employment for those young people who have to overcome obstacles to progress.

This past year has seen a process of rebuilding activities and interventions after Covid and Sofronie has continued with partner charities to fund projects which benefit those who have encountered difficulties.

Looking ahead to the coming year, the Foundation's mission remains unchanged. We will continue to create opportunities to improve social mobility for young people who are experiencing challenges and obstacles. The board remains committed in supporting Codam College Amsterdam in providing free computer software education and work internships and assist in securing meaningful work to an expanding cohort. This support has already made a significant impact for students and secured employment for over 150 Codam students.

For the coming year, the Sofronie board is keen to find ways in which younger students can access learning with creative technologies and will endeavour to pursue activities which can inspire and nurture talent to benefit from the impact of creative skillsets for all types of work of the future.
